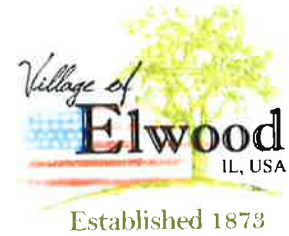

Development Proposals Under Study

The Village has been approached by two separate development groups.

J-Power USA is exploring the development of a state of the art combined cycle power plant to complement their existing peaker power plant. This new plant, located at Brandon and Noel Roads, uses a gas turbine for 60 percent of its power and then recovers waste heat to generate an additional 40 percent of the power in a steam turbine, leading to more efficiency in power generation. It is expected the new plant would generate enough energy to power 1.2 million homes. The following benefits have been presented by J-Power USA:

- > The plant will help keep Illinois' power prices competitive
- > Take advantage of abundant, affordable natural gas
- > Reduce Illinois' dependence on older, inefficient power generation plants
- > Be up to 50% more efficient than peaking plants
- > Have the lowest emissions of any fossil fuel plant in Illinois
- > Support intermittent wind and solar energy generation
- > Stimulate the local economy with jobs and property taxes

The zoning of the project site is heavy industrial and is located in the Village of Elwood. This project is in the early stages of analysis by the Village staff.

NorthPoint Development is in discussion with the Village regarding a 2,200 acre business park. Public meetings have been held for the Compass Business Park soliciting input from area residents through an open house and individual and small group meetings. Feral Cat Challenge

The Village of Elwood is not immune from the challenges of a burgeoning colony of feral cats. Recently several complaints were received at Village Hall and the Police Department was requested to look into the matter.

The feeding or harboring of these animals is causing a nuisance for the surrounding neighborhoods. The cat crisis can lead to areas taken over by feral cats that disturb residents, with the areas riddled with cat feces and urine as well as newborn kittens and numerous cat fights.

The Elwood Police Department would like to remind residents that the Animal Control Ordinance of the Village of Elwood regulates the duties and requirements for cat and dog owners.

Village Ordinance No. 911, restricts a single-family residence to three dogs or three cats, either singly or in combination. No dog, cat or other domestic animals shall be allowed or permitted to run at large upon any

developers have created five teams to study the project's viability and potential benefits to the Village. The five teams meet periodically to collaborate and develop an overall comprehensive plan to be presented to the Village Planning & Zoning Commission and then to the Village Board.

Planning Team is developing the Compass Business Park Master Plan. The master plan will provide an overall development concept and guidelines for individual site development.

Financial Team is determining if the project provides additional revenues for area taxing bodies and to support the Village's future budget constraints and compensation for Village services. (See article entitled "Village Contracts For A Financial Management Plan")

Engineering Team is examining the need for additional sewer and water capacity, streets, storm water management and other infrastructure improvements.

Traffic Team is evaluating the closed loop truck access system, employee monitored access points to support existing and future employee traffic, increased traffic on surrounding arterials, farm access and the need for an additional traffic signal on Illinois Route 53.

Public Safety Team is reviewing emergency access plans, appropriate staffing and equipment needs and resident safety.

It is important that this thorough due diligence be conducted, as it is crucial to the Village's decision-making process.

Additionally, owners must have their animal vaccinated against rabies and the animal must wear a tag. All cats and dogs shall be on a dependable lead no longer than eight feet, except on the owner's premises. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, shelter, feed or care for any dangerous, vicious or wild/feral animal within the village.

In response to concerns raised by residents over feral cats the Elwood Police Department has contacted Will County Animal Control. Will County Animal control will be involved with trapping and removing the feral cats from the village.

The traps will be monitored by Will County Animal Control and Elwood Police. To report a feral cat problem, please contact the Elwood Police Department at 815-423-5411 or Will County Animal Control at 815-462-5633.

Grass clippings should not be blown into the street as it clogs drains and can cause rain water flooding.

Village Contracts for Financial Management Plan

The Village has been approached by two developers about the opportunities to locate new businesses within the Village. There has been discussion about the potential impact of these opportunities to the Village, from a financial perspective as well as other quality of life issues.

The Village has recently contracted with Ehlers, a financial consulting firm, who will create a Financial Management Plan (FMP). The FMP will assist the Village to evaluate these development opportunities and provide input on how the projects may help the Village in resolving its financial challenges.

The Village currently has four outstanding General Obligation (G.O.) debt issues. All the G.O. bonds were issued more than 10 years ago by the Village under the assumption that the Village would develop at a rate and level that has not yet been realized.

The economic recession that began in 2008 led to stagnant growth in areas which were previously identified to have enormous residential and commercial potential. Village infrastructure including water and sewer facilities, road improvements and Village Hall construction were built according to those plans and the Village anticipated that its ability to pay debt service for infrastructure would increase as the residential and commercial development was completed, as is the

case in many growing communities.

The demands of the debt service payment have put stress on the Village's financial situation. The Village has expended cash in the (water, sewer and garbage) funds in order to support governmental activities and debt service. While the General Fund operates at a "break-even level", the bonds that will require payments starting in 2021 and beyond will necessitate additional new revenue sources. It is the goal of the financial planning process to help the Village to identify those revenues.

As part of the financial planning process, The FMP will incorporate potential costs and revenues from these projects so that the Village can determine if there is a net financial gain to the Village.

For a more sustainable financial plan for future Village operations, debt restructuring and expenditure reductions will help, but the Village needs to generate significant new revenues and expand its tax base to pay for its current and future services and debt obligations.

Therefore, it is in the Village's best interest to fully evaluate any new economic development opportunities presented.

Leave the Fireworks to the Professionals

The Elwood Police Department has received an increase of complaints related to fireworks and loud noise. Residents can help combat the nuisance by immediately reporting violations by calling the dispatch non-emergency line at 815-423-5411. The caller should provide the location and description of the offenders. You should instantly dial 911 if the fireworks are an immediate threat to life or property.

In Illinois, it is illegal to possess, purchase or use consumer fireworks without a consumer permit obtained from the State of Illinois and authorized by local officials.

Every year illegal fireworks are to blame for fatalities, injuries, fire, and millions of dollars in property damage, not to mention the loud noise nuisance suffered by surrounding neighborhoods.

Two state laws control the use, sale, distribution, and possession of fireworks in Illinois. Additionally, violators can be cited for a separate violation of the Village's Unreasonable Noise Nuisance Ordinance. Any person causing or permitting the nuisance can be fined.

So, come on out and enjoy the professional fireworks during this year's Elwood Community Days. The fireworks will be launched from Lloyd Erickson Park 801 N. Chicago Street, on Saturday, August 26 8:45 PM.
